

AMERICAN LARCH (TAMARACK)

Larix laricina

Height: 40-50' **Spread:** 15-30'

Location: Zone 3, full sun, native

Shape: Upright, pyramidal

Foliage: Bright green, yellow in fall

Notes: The Tamarack Larch is a unique species in that it is technically not an evergreen tree [an evergreen conifer], but rather it is a *deciduous conifer*. Its light blue-green needles turn a spectacular golden color in the fall and then drop to create a carpet of wonderful pine straw across the ground. In the spring they green up at about the same rate as leafy deciduous trees.



WEEPING EUROPEAN LARCH

Larix decidua 'Pendula'

Height: 15-20' **Spread:** 6-8'

Location: Zone 3, full sun

Shape: Weeping, upright

Foliage: Luminous green, yellow in fall

Notes: The long branches of this tall tree arch gracefully downward with their pendulous branchlets; irregular in habit & attractive even when leafless in winter.
